Sub:- Cases of misappropriation of money – Amendment in the powers given to various agencies for conducting investigation as per fixed pecuniary limits - Changes –

Ref:- 1) GO(P)No.21/2010/Vig dated 09.06.2010
2) GO(P)No.21/2017/Vig dated 24.09.2017

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01. As per the Government Order cited 1st, the cases of misappropriation by Government servants or of Government money involving amount upto Rs.2 lakh are to be investigated by the Local Police, case of misappropriation between Rs.2 lakhs and Rs.5 lakhs are to be investigated by the CBCID and the case above Rs.5 lakhs are to be investigated by the Vigilance & Anti-Corruption Bureau.

02. Now a modified Government Order was issued vide reference 2nd, wherein it was ordered that **misappropriation of cases coming under the purview of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 are to be investigated by the VACB without any restriction of financial limits** and the cases registered under Section 406 of the IPC against public servant(s) or by banker are to be investigated by the Local Police (GO enclosed).

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03. In this regard, it may be noted that, VACB has been constituted as a Special Unit to deal with offences under the Prevention of Corruption Act (PC Act). Unless provisions of PC Act are invoked in a case, there will be no jurisdiction in the VACB. The VACB conducts verification / enquiry to know whether any offence under the PC Act has been committed or not. As far as registration of a case is concerned, without invoking provisions of PC Act, VACB will have no legal jurisdiction.

04. This must be understood by one and all.
